# Public Policy Polly Leveen

Last week the House passed the Senate version of the VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN ACT (VAWA). The vote was 286 to 138. All women, and it includes a diverse description, plus students on college campuses will be protected.

An effort to cut \$85billion in federal spending through this year, called sequestration, began March 1. Will there be a solution for this extreme measure which will effect our economy as well as the income of many workers? Political analysts say we won't know until almost the end of the month.

AAUW national membership dues are \$49. Of that amount, **\$46 is tax deductible as a charitable contribution**, and \$3 is not deductible because it supports the QQUW Action Fund's section 501(c)(4) Lobby Corps and get-out-the-vote activities. Branch/state portions of dues are not tax deductible.

Finally, Equal Pay Day will be coming up on April 9. Each year we seem to making progress but it is a slow one. Right now, studies show that nationwide women still earn 82 percent of what men earn. In New York it is slightly better with women earning 84 percent of what men earn. Minority women earn even far less than that.

After President Obama's inaugural address, urging that women and girls should be able to "earn a living equal to their efforts", both the House and the Senate reintroduced the current Fair Pay Act. In New York State,

# **AAUW Introduces New Logo, Tagline, and Website**

February 20, 2013. Today, AAUW is proud to debut some big changes. The website redesign allows for complete mobile access and features expanded and improved social media integration for all our online content. This integration should make the site more user friendly, provide a better experience for Smartphone and tablet users, and create greater visibility for AAUW.

As plans for the new website unfolded, the AAUW Board of Directors decided to move forward with a new logo to accompany the

updated site. Our most recent logo was introduced in 1990, and it was starting to show its age, especially in an increasingly digital world. A logo working group, composed of board members and staff, took on the task of creating the new logo. They wanted a modern, more readable typeface for the logo and a tagline that would instantly convey who we are and what we do. The new logo emphasizes the "W" as the central element of our name and work and has a more global look.

To develop the tagline, the

working group tried another new trend, crowdsourcing. They posted a description of AAUW and our communications goals on Crowdspring and invited freelance writers from around the world to submit ideas. The process netted more than 2,000 entries and showed remarkable consensus around the themes of empowerment and AAUW's extensive history. The working group guickly settled on "Empowering women since 1881" as the new tagline, and the board approved it unanimously in October.


