


Books & Bites Betty Reiter, Chair

Tell NY Legislators to Pass 10-Point Women's Equality Act

As you may know, the American Association of University Women of New York State (AAUW-NYS) teamed up with over 800 organizations across New York earlier this year to urge the state legislature to pass the 10-point Women's Equality Act (A. 8070). Included in the bill's 10 provisions are measures to achieve pay equity, and employment and lending discrimination, improve domestic violence and human trafficking protections, and ensure a woman has the right to make her own decisions about her body.

The Assembly passed the legislation - in its entirety - in June. The Senate, however, passed only 9 out of 10 points - as if to say to women across New York that they are only willing to protect nine-tenths of our lives and bodies. Thus, both chambers ended the legislative session in June, without passing this critical legislation.

But the fight is not over! We have until December 31 to urge the legislature to come back to Albany and pass this critical legislation.

Take action before its too late! Write a letter to the editor to your local newspaper, urging your state assemblyperson and senator to return to Albany to finish what they started - the pas-

sage of the full 10-point Women's Equality Act.

Why December 31? Because January 1, 2014, will be the start of a new legislative session, and all legislation that has not been passed by this date will have to begin the process all over again. If we have to start over, we will; we will not give up this fight. But it would be much easier to pick up where we left off - before the end of this session.

Use AAUW's Two-Minute Activist tool to submit a letter to the editor today! We've got sample text ready for you to use, so writing a letter to the editor has never been easier. These letters to the editor will help us put the public pressure on the State Assembly and Senate to come back to Albany and pass all 10 points of the Women's Equality Act.

Our elected officials must act now, and your letter to the editor can push them to act!

Tech Trek: Coming to a Campus Near You Alexa Silverman

In 2014, AAUW will expand our STEM-focused (science, technology, engineering, and math) summer camp program to three new college and university campuses in New Mexico, Oregon, and Alabama. New Mexico State University, Las Cruces; Tillamook Bay Community College; and the University of Alabama, Huntsville, will join universities in Florida, Ohio, Oklahoma, and Washington to host the camp in 2014 for local girls.

Tech Trek is a one-week science, technology, engineering, and math camp for rising eighthgrade girls. The program got its start 15 years ago, when AAUW of California member Marie Wolbach applied for an AAUW Community Action Grant to open a science camp for girls on the

(both for 10 year terms), have more than one candidate running. We will hear from those candidates, as well as entertain questions from the floor.

The event is free, and open to the public. Light refreshments will be served. The "Meet the Candidates Night", is cohosted by the Chemung County Council of Women, the League of Women Voters of Chemung County, the Elmira/Corning Branch NAACP, and the YWCA Elmira & the Twin Tiers.

Stanford University campus. Wolbach and AAUW of California have since expanded the program to 10 camps in California alone.

After seeing how effective the program is — alumnae are more likely than their peers to take advanced science and math classes and eventually to go to college — AAUW decided to expand the program nationwide. In 2013, Tech Trek was expanded to four states, across the country and is already changing the lives of the girls who attended.

The program puts AAUW's Why So Few? research report into action. Tech Trek's formula follows the report's recommendations, introducing girls to role models and career choices and giving campers the opportunity to reside on a college campus.
