SEXUAL ASSAULT on College Campuses and how to end it continues to dominate the Public Policy news in the AAUW WASHINGTON UPDATE. AAUW has been pushing for over a year to make campus safety a priority. More and more survivors have come forward. The Department of Education has "ramped" up... The White House has officially created a CAMPUS SEXUAL ASSAULT TASK FORCE and has issued a new call for action for safer campuses.

The following efforts have been made also:

- Recommendations by the White House launching a NEW WEBSITE to keep the conversation of the attempts going.
- The Dept. of Education's Civil Rights office issued a document to guide schools on how to effectively implement Title IX and respond to sexual assault complaints.

AAUW's VP of Government Relations, Lisa M. Maatz is quoted in the USA NEWS and WORLD as saying "I want colleges to step up to the plate and say 'we know this is an issue, (not just Public Relations) and we're taking our head out of the sand..."


