Dakota, plus a non-binding measure passed in Illinois. Voters defeated personhood amendments in Colorado and North Dakota. but unfortunately a Tennessee ballot initiative was approved that will give state lawmakers more power to restrict and regulate abortion. Oregon passed a state version of the Equal Rights Amendment, and voters in Massachusetts, Oakland (CA), and Montclair and Trenton (NJ) passed ballot initiatives guaranteeing paid sick days to more workers. These results will positively affect women and families nationwide, we hope they encourage branches to expand state and municipal advocacy efforts.
